
Family Nights October 4 4 5

Lunch Bunch



What is Lunch Bunch all about? We would like to provide you with additional information concerning the Lunch Bunch program. Throughout the school year we will be offering 2 and 3 week sessions of Lunch Bunch. Your child will be taken to lunch bunch or dropped off in their classroom by the preschool staff, depending on if they are morning or afternoon students. Hence, you are not required to do anything. The children will enjoy their packed lunch with the other students and teachers. This allows the children extra time with friends and the parents extra time for work, to run errands, exercise or spend time with a younger sibling.

After having lunch, the children participate in a project, most likely based on a book they are reading that particular week. This year we will be focusing on the "letter of the week." The children will have an opportunity to participate in a group art creation for each letter, hear a story and create an individual art to take home. The students are generally very excited to be able to eat lunch at school like the "big kids."

Our first lunch bunch session begins next week. We still have room in our Tuesday and Friday sessions. Please contact the office if you would like your child to participate.

Storytime & Play with Ms. J.

I was very excited to introduce myself to all of you last week. My time spent with the children is such a joy for me. Last week we spent time with Old MacDonald and a barnyard of animals found on a farm. The children identified each animal by listening to the sounds they make and/or the word clues given about each animal. The boys and girls met the chicken that laid all the shaky eggs that we use to move and dance with all around our room.

Our journey through the alphabet began this week. As was our first letter, which was a perfect match for our book "Apple Trouble." Now that autumn is here, fledgie the hedgehog built a nest in preparation for the fast approaching colder weather. Unfortunately he runs into trouble. An apple falls from the tree and sticks to him. Squirrel, pig and frog come to the rescue and try to help, but only make matters worse. The children counted with me as more items become stuck. We did some serious problem solving as to how our animal friends would help fledgie. One child suggested that we get an elephant to blow off the items. If you have a chance, ask your child how the story ended.
