Director's Corner

Encouraging Conversation and Confidence

Your child's artwork is an important aspect of their preschool day. They have spent time, energy and their imagination creating their pieces of art. You, as their parent, want to encourage and praise their efforts. Words such as "this is amazing" or "good job" are fine, but they are closed statements that require no response from your child. Positive reinforcement can be done through statements that encourage your child and also draw them into a conversation.

Here a few suggestions that you might want to try:

- Your picture is beautiful, can you tell me about it?
- I can see that you used a lot of feathers, let's count them.
- I noticed that you used a lot of green and blue in your picture, which is your favorite?
- Describe the picture to your child. I see...
- How did you make all those buttons stick to the paper?
- Wow, you used a lot of paint today. What colors do we see?
- I can see that you used red and yellow. I noticed that where the two colors are touching a new color has appeared. What is that color? What do you think happened?
- I see that you made a handprint. Did someone paint your hand? Did it tickle? Let's count your fingers.
- I see that you made a turtle. What did you learn about turtles today? Follow up with "wow, you really know a lot about turtles."
