Bring the Farm to You - Chick Hatching

Monday, September 25, will begin our journey through a chicken's life cycle. This is a favorite learning experience among the staff and children, as the chick life process is discovered before our very eyes. Letter of the Week

We will begin our journey through the alphabet on Monday, September 25th. Your child will be bringing home a folder with information and "homework." Homework will be sent home each week that coincides with the letter that is being introduced. We follow the Orton Gillingham approach to the alphabet, which is a multi-sensory tool for learning letters and sounds. A key component of this approach is that the letters are introduced in a specific order, rather than the traditional idea of Aa to Zz. For instance, we will begin with the letter Aa, but then move quickly to letters Tt, Bb, Ll, Ff, Hh, Pp... In essence, we are teaching the letters that will begin to form rhyming words, such as bat, pat, hat... Please do not stress over the "homework" being sent home. If your child is not ready to sit down and complete the work, there are many other ways to introduce the letters to your child in a more play-based manner. Let us know if you would like ideas in how to do so at home.

PARKING LOT SAFETY

It is imperative that all drivers within the HUMC Preschool parking lot abide by the following rules.

WE NEED EVERYONE TO BE SAFE!

- ⇒ Your foot should not be on the gas pedal when driving in the parking lot. A very slow coast is the safest speed to travel.
- ⇒ Refrain from cell phone use in the parking lot, whether you are walking with your child or driving your vehicle.
- \Rightarrow Do not park in the fire lane. The lane is designated for emergency vehicles only.
- ⇒ Follow the directional lines to ensure that traffic is flowing in a proper order.
- ⇒ Watch for little ones and please hold your child's hand when crossing through the lanes.
- ⇒ When entering or exiting the playground, please, please, shut the gate.
